Born and educated in Aberdeen, Ian Wood graduated from Aberdeen University in 1964 with a First Class Honours Degree in Psychology. In 1984 he was awarded an Honorary Degree of LL.D from Aberdeen University, an Honorary DBA from Robert Gordon University (RGU), Aberdeen in 1998 and in 2002 an Honorary Doctor of Technology from Glasgow Caledonian University.

Chairman and Chief Executive, John Wood Group PLC since January 1982 and Chairman since January 2007, the company is quoted on the LSE and employs 41,000 people in 50 countries worldwide with annual sales of US\$6bn. Chairman of J W Holdings Limited, one of Scotland's largest fishing groups and Chancellor of Robert Gordon University.

Current and past appointments: membership of PILOT (joint Government/Oil & Gas Industry Initiative) and joint Chairman of the Oil & Gas Industry Leadership Team; Chairman of Scottish Enterprise; Chairman of the British Trade International Oil & Gas Export Board (previously OSO); member of the Scottish Sea Fisheries Council.

He was awarded the CBE in the 1982 New Year's Honours List and a Knighthood in 1994.



Biography

Dr. Alan L. Bain



Alan Bain, a naturalized U.S. citizen, was born in England of Scottish parents. He graduated from English private school, Mill Hill, spent one year at America's Gunnery School as an English Speaking Union Exchange Scholar. Following National Service as an officer in The Worcestershire Regiment he obtained a law degree from St. Catharine's College, Cambridge University (1960). He was admitted to the English Bar as a member of the Honourable Society of the Inner Temple where he was an Inner Temple Scholar. In 1961, he left for the U.S. to attend Columbia Law School. He was elected class president all three years and graduated in 1964 and was admitted to the New York State Bar the following year. He practiced privately and corporately until

1970 when he founded World-Wide Business Centres, Inc. pioneering the shared office industry internationally through World-Wide Business Centres Network, Inc. The Network Company, a brand licensing company, was established in 1974 operating in 18 countries until downsized in 2002. He has served as WWBC's CEO since inception.

In 1991, WWBC offered free accommodation to The American-Scottish Foundation®, an arrangement that continues. In 1993, he was elected ASF's President becoming President Emeritus in 2010.

In 1995, he and his late wife, Linda, visited the Isle of Lewis to assess how the introduction of a new double width loom designed for the Harris Tweed industry was faring. ASF had helped finance its introduction. Ten years later he invested in The Carloway Mill, a producer of Harris Tweed, and has spent the past seven years actively involved in reviving the mill and the industry. Travelling regularly to Scotland over the past twenty years, he has been heavily engaged in a wide range of American Scottish activities.

He has received the following awards in recognition of his work on behalf of Scotland. In 2011, "International Services to Scotland Leader of the Year" at the "Scottish Leadership Awards" dinner presented by Business Insider Magazine; in 2009, an Honorary Doctorate from Queen Margaret University; in 2004, Scotland Magazine's "Scotsman of the Year Award"; in 2001, The Scotsman newspaper 's "Ambassador of the Year Award"; and, in 1995, the "Ellis Island Medal of Honor". In 1987, he was presented with Trail Blazer Camps Centennial Medal in recognition of his 20 years of service on its Board, ten of them as chairman. Trail Blazers serves underprivileged children from New York City and Sussex County, New Jersey.

He has two children, Heather and Ian, and twin grandchildren, Andrew and Emma. His wife, Linda, died in 2006 after 47 years of marriage. He is a member of The University Club in New York City which he served as a Council member and Vice President; and of London's Oxford and Cambridge Club and the Marylebone Cricket Club.

Biography

Miss Duncan MacDonald



If ever it were necessary to find one word that would describe Duncan MacDonald's interests, that word would surely be "communication". She is well known in broadcasting as a producer and commentator in both radio and television. Her broadcasts have originated from Edinburgh, Moscow, Paris, Milan, Glasgow, London, and other international centers and she has been fortunate to interview personalities such as: U.S. Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas, humorist Art Buchwald, musician Benny Goodman, actress Helen Heyes and

numerous others. Her daily afternoon program, "Observation Point", on the prestigious New York Times radio station WQXR was for many years an international crossroads.

Duncan began her career in television, producing over 4,000 hours of TV programs for NBC-TV and DuMont TV in New York City, moving on to radio both in New York City and Boston, serving as Home and Food Editor of Yankee Magazine for 15 years, and writing a column for House Beautiful "Scene From Here", as well as being named communications liaison for the publication.

She is a past president of the New York Chapter of American Women in Radio and Television and became a Trustee and Executive Director of the National Friends of Public Broadcasting.

In the early 1970s Miss MacDonald became a member of the American-Scottish Foundation®, working closely with Lady Malcolm Douglas-Hamilton. In 1974 she and Lady Malcolm decided there should be a "Scotland Week", a precursor to the more recently established annual celebration of Scottish pride, "Tartan Week", of which Miss MacDonald was the lead driving force.

Duncan MacDonald continues her work as a volunteer in several Scottish organizations, including the Scottish Society of Martha's Vineyard of which she is one of the founders, and the Caledonian Foundation USA, Inc., where she serves as a Trustee and Executive Vice President. She is, in addition, a Trustee of The Scottish Coalition USA.

Today, The Carloway Mill have brought The Murray of Atholl tartan back to life. It will be sold and marketed around the world, to celebrate the history, tradition, the provenance of over 160 years of hand loom weaving on the Isle of Lewis.





The Wallace Award®

Background

The American-Scottish Foundation[®] introduced the Wallace Award[®] in 1970. It was awarded annually until 1988. After a hiatus, the Foundation revived the Wallace Award in 2000. The recipient was Senator Trent Lott, then United States Senate Majority Leader, who received the Award in recognition of his sponsorship of Senate Resolution 155 that adopted April 6, in perpetuity, as National Tartan Day.

The Award was originally conceived as a singular opportunity to recognize the extraordinary diversity of contributions that Scots have made to the world; and, in particular, to recognize one or more living citizens or residents of the United States of Scottish descent for their individual contributions to the well being of this country. The Foundation has now expanded the Award's reach to include Scots, Americans and Canadians who have made an important contribution to American/Scottish relationships. Honorees are selected by the Board of Directors of the American-Scottish Foundation from nominations submitted by interested groups.

Purposes

- To recognize living citizens or residents of the United States or Canada of Scottish Descent for outstanding achievement or significant contribution in their field of endeavor.
- To recognize "in memoriam" citizens or residents of the United States or Canada of Scottish descent for outstanding achievement or significant contribution in their field of endeavor.
- To recognize living Scots and Americans for their contribution to Scottish-American relationships.




