At 1,146 acres, Van Cortlandt Park offers a forested retreat in the northwest Bronx that is home to the borough's oldest historic house and largest freshwater lake, and the oldest public golf course in the United States (1895).

Kiwi Club of New York

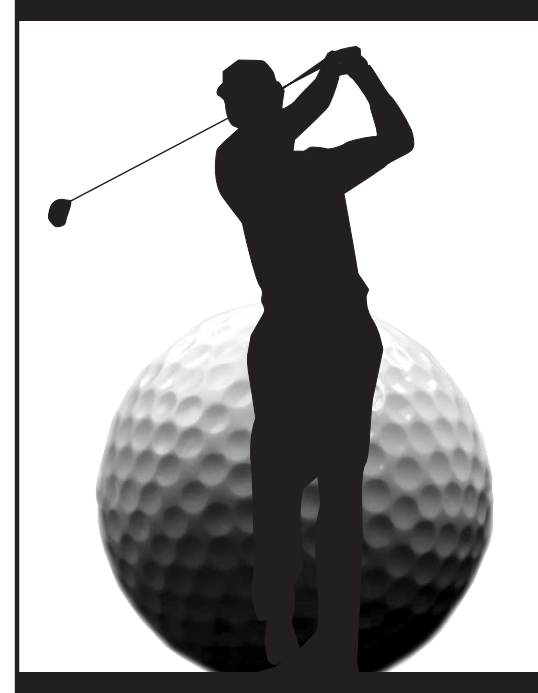

- The fee includes: greens fee, parking, shared motor cart, luncheon, on-course snack, prizes and awards dinner, including entertainment, and single malt scotch tasting
- U.S.G.A. rules will govern play
- Scramble/Best Ball format will be used
- Awards: Hole-in-One; Team: Best and Second Best score and "Most Honest"; Mens and Womens: Closest to Pin, Longest Drive, and Straightest Drive
