In the Footsteps of John Muir traces Muir's life from his early days in Dunbar, Scotland to his love of Yosemite. The exhibit showcases the natural beauty of the environment Muir loved and did so much to help preserve.

John Muir (1838-1914) was born in Dunbar, East Lothian, Scotland.

He became an American naturalist, author, and early advocate of preservation of wilderness in the United States.

He is today referred to as the "Father of the National Parks".

In the Footsteps of John Muir is exhibited during Scotland-Tartan Week, the Year of Natural Scotland, the 175th Anniversary of the birth of John Muir (April 21) and Earth Day (April 22). It will be open to the public, free of charge, April 3 - April 26 : Monday - Friday (9am - 5pm).
